## TREE PLANTING GUIDE

1. **PLANNING** – take time to site your tree areas with regards to :
  - (a) wind directions
  - (b) mature height of trees
  - (c) water logging – drainage
  - (d) fauna corridors
  
2. **PREPARATION**
  - (a) If possible, rip and mound tree areas. Ripping is best done when soil is dry.
  - (b) Fence to exclude livestock, vermin, etc
  - (c) Wait for weed germination after opening rains.
  - (d) Remove weeds by cultivation or by spraying with knockdown and residual herbicides.
  
3. **PLANTING**
  - (a) Make sure the seedling root ball is covered by at least 1cm of soil.
  - (b) Press down soil around seedling to exclude air.
  - (c) Do not plant seedling too deep or into flooded soil.
  - (d) Fertilize seedling at planting or within 8 weeks of planting. Use tree tablets; compound fertilizer or animal by products.

**Do not use high nitrogen products in dry or warm weather.  
Place fertilizer at least 15cm from the seedling.**
