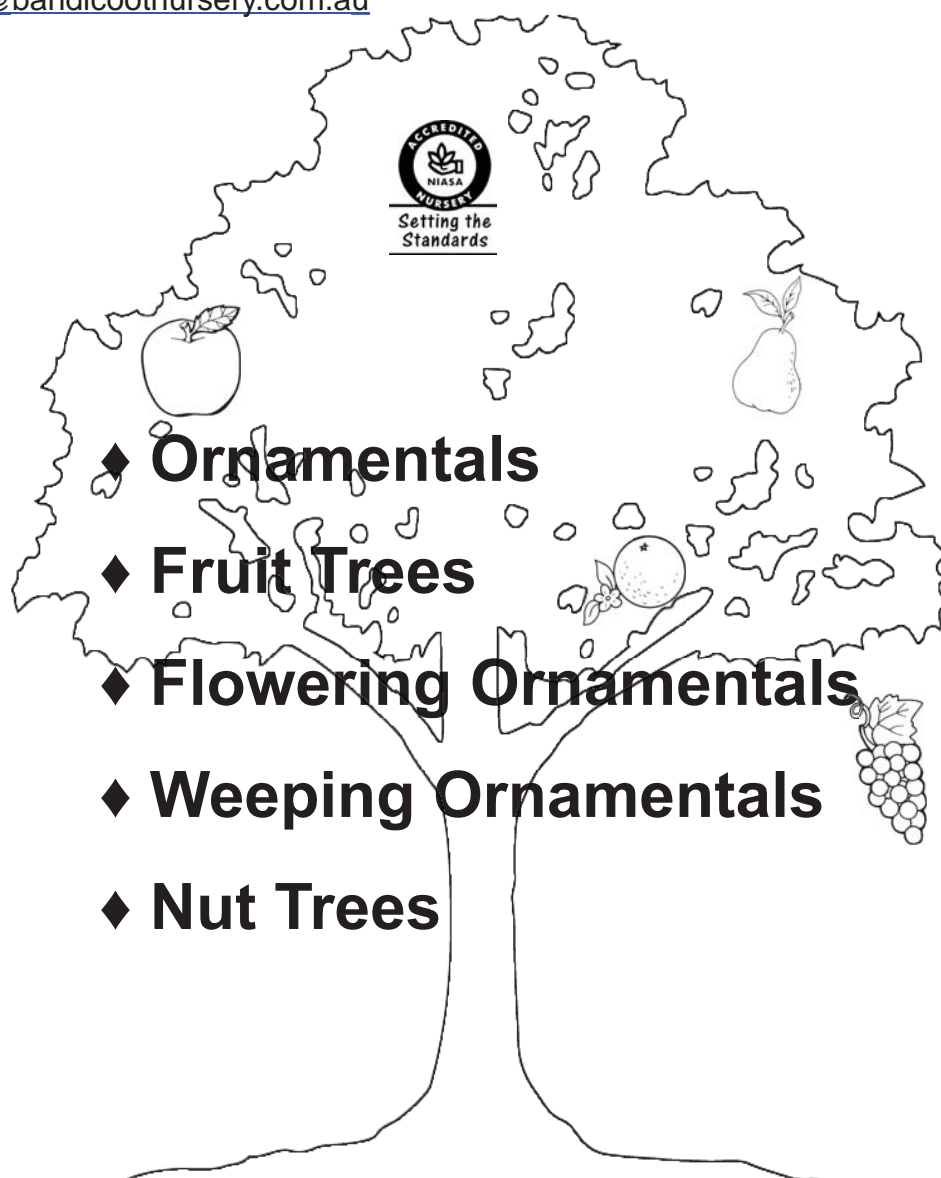

Name	Description	Approx Prices
<i>Acer negundo</i> Box Elder	A wide spreading, rounded tree with a moderate growth rate, reaching 12 x 8m. Large pale green leaves with 3 - 5 leaflets. Ideal to varied conditions. Wind resistant but drought tender.	\$30.00
<i>Acer palmatum</i> Japanese Maple (Green)	A deciduous tree that grows to a height of 8 x 3m. This maple requires a well drained, open sunny position. In the spring the flowers are purplish ink occurring in erect corymbs.	\$30.00
<i>Acer palmatum atropurpureum</i> Japanese Maple (Red)	A vase shaped tree growing 5m high. This maple has a glorious wine-red spring growth. This maple makes a spectacular centre piece to any large garden.	\$30.00
<i>Acer platanoides</i> Norway Maple	A large spreading tree with a vigorous growth rate, reaching 40 x 5 m. Has large serrated leaves, turning golden yellow in Autumn. Fragrant flowers occur in clusters in Spring. Prefers an open sunny position.	\$30.00
<i>Acer rubrum</i> Canadian or Red Maple	Long stalked leaves with distinctive triangular lobes and toothed margins. Dark green leaves turning deep red in Autumn. Bare branches are covered by tiny red flowers in Spring followed by red winged seeds. Height 10 - 15m	\$30.00
<i>Acer saccharum</i> Sugar Maple	Deciduous tree grows to 12 - 15m. In cool climates the coppery autumn colour is spectacular. Can be grown in warmer districts. Yellow cluster flowers in spring.	\$30.00
<i>Betula alba</i> Silver Birch	An upright, open spreading tree, reaching 20 x 5 m, with a moderate growth rate. Leaves are bright green, trunk is silver/white. Suits most soils. Is drought and frost resistant. Good for group planting.	\$30.00
<i>Fraxinus americana</i> White Ash	A large spreading tree, reaching 40 x 5m with a moderate to fast growth rate. Leaves are large green serrate. Flowers occur in dense clusters. Excellent shade tree.	\$30.00

<i>Fraxinus raywood</i> Claret Ash	A medium tree with a open canopy, reaching 12 x 9m with a fast growth rate. Leaves are a deep claret colour in Autumn. A good tree for planting in parks and streets. Prefers an open sunny position.	\$30.00

<i>Gleditsia triacanthos</i> Shademaster	An open, upright tree, reaching 8 x 6m with a fast growth rate. Leaves are dark green and pinnate. Prefers an open sunny position but will tolerate shade.	\$29.00
<i>Gleditsia triacanthos</i> Sunburst	An open, rounded tree, becoming pendulous, reaching 8 x 8m with a fast growth rate. Fern like leaves, new growth is yellow turning green with maturity. Open sunny position.	\$30.00
Jacaranda Mimosifolia	A fast growing tree with attractive fern like foliage. In spring the divided leaves turn yellow and are shed. Large drooping bunches of lilac tubular flowers. Height to 10m	\$36.00
<i>Koelreuteria paniculata</i> Golden Rain Tree	An erect, spreading tree, with a rounded crown, reaching 6 x 3m. Has 7 - 15 ovate acuminate leaflets, turning orange in autumn. Flowers are yellow to orange lantern pods. Heat and drought tolerant. Magnificent decorative	\$30.00
<i>Melia azedarach</i> White Cedar	Native, deciduous, medium tree with spreading crown. Sprays of lilac flowers in Spring and yellow berries in autumn. Ornamental shade tree. Well drained soil. Drought tolerant	\$30.00
<i>Platanus acerifolia</i> London Plane	A large tree, if left will grow to a height of 35m. The leaves are lobed and around 20cm long a deep green on top and lighter beneath. Flowers are very small occurring in late spring, the fruit is a rounded spiky cluster. Suitable for large parks	\$30.00
<i>Platanus orientalis</i> Oriental Plane	An erect, branching shaped tree, reaching 35 x 5m with a fast growing rate. Leaves are light green, palmate and deeply divided. Prefers cool deep soil. Good for street planting, also large parks and gardens.	\$30.00

<i>Pyrus calleryana</i> Bradford	A medium sized, broad, conical tree, reaching 10 x 6m. Leaves are dark green and glossy, turning orange, yellow, red and purple in Autumn. Produces masses of white flowers in Spring. Tolerates most soil types.	\$30.00
<i>Pyrus salicifolia</i> Silver Leaf Pear	An erect and slender tree with willowy pendant branches, 6 x 2m in size, with a moderate growth rate. Leaves are glossy green and silvery when young. White single flowers, small fruit.	\$60.00
<i>Pyrus ussuriensis</i> Manchurian Pear	A small to medium sized tree, producing white flowers in early Spring. Leaves are shiny and green during the Summer months. Leaves change to a variety of Autumn tones.	\$38.00
<i>Quercus coccinea</i> Scarlet Oak	Pyramid shaped tree, 15 x 8m with glossy leaves turning scarlet in Autumn. Will tolerate most soils (including wet), but drought tender.	\$30.00
<i>Quercus palustris</i> Pin Oak	One of the faster growing oaks reaching 8 x 15m. Has pendulous branches with bright green leaves that turn a spectacular red in Autumn.	\$30.00
<i>Quercus robur</i> English Oak	An erect, stout and branching tree, reaching 30 x 6m with a fairly slow growth rate. Leaves dark green and glossy with 5 or 7 pairs of broad lobes. <i>Ulmus glabra pendula</i> Weeping Elm	Large round leaves, rough and serrated, on branches weeping down from the high grafts.	\$110.00
<i>Ulmus parvifolia</i> Chinese Elm	An erect tree, with gracefully arching branches, reaching 10 x 4m with a moderate growth rate. Leaves are glossy green and serrate. Adapts to most soils and conditions. Colourful mottled bark. Excellent shade tree.	\$38.00
<i>Ulmus pendula</i> Weeping Elm	Grafted at approximately two metres with elegant pendulous branchlets with dark green leaves.	\$110.00
<i>Ulmus vanhoutti</i> Golden Elm	An erect, branching tree with a rounded crown reaching 30 x 5m. Leaves are 15 cm long with double serrate margins, turning gold in autumn. Prefers and open sunny position. Popular choice for home gardens.	\$30.00
<i>Zelkova serrata</i> Japanese Elm	An, erect, branching tree, reaching 20 x 4m with a fast growth rate when young. Leaves are narrow, heart shaped and tapering, 10cm long with serrated margins. Sunny position.	\$38.00

Florabunda	A small round tree which grows to a size of 3 x 3m, growth rate is moderate. This variety tolerates warmer areas. Flowers are white to pink, one of the best varieties.	\$30.00
Golden Hornet	A small open tree with long spreading branches. Buds are deep pink opening to a single white flower. Flowers mid -Spring. Produces a heavy crop of bright yellow fruit. This particular cultivar is the best one for the pollination of apple varieties.	\$30.00
Purpurea	A medium to small tree with dark to purplish/green leaves. Flowers are crimson/red in colour which are then followed by crimson/purple coloured fruits.	\$30.00

<i>Prunus serrulata</i> Flowering Cherry - Red	Deciduous to 7m in height. Double deep red blossom in Spring. New foliage is a bronze colour.	\$85.00
<i>Prunus serrulata</i> Flowering Cherry - Pink	Deciduous to 7m in height. Double pink blossom in Spring. New foliage is a bronze colour.	\$85.00
<i>Prunus subhirtella autumnalis</i> Autumn Cherry	Deciduous small tree, semi-doubled white flowers produced intermittently from late Autumn to Spring.	\$85.00

Blireanna	An upright spreading tree, grows to a size of 4 x 4m, growth rate is moderate to fast. Mass blossoms are double rose pink, leaves are bronze in colour. Flowers appear late Winter. A hardy cultivar. Great specimen tree.	\$30.00
Elvins	An upright spreading tree, grows to a 3 x 3m, growth rate is moderate. Blossoms are single white which then change in colour to pink. Flowers mid Spring.	\$30.00
Nigra	An upright rounded tree, grows to a height of 5 x 4m, growth rate is moderate. Flowers are single pink with deep purple foliage. A very popular variety.	\$30.00
Wrightii	A small upright tree, grows to a height of 4 x 3m, growth rate is moderate to fast. Blossoms are very large and pink, foliage is an attractive purple colour.	\$30.00
ALMONDS		
Branches Jordan	A useful variety where there is a problem with birds attacking soft shelled almonds. Sweet and plump, this variety suits hot climate. Matures early February. Pollinators : Johnston Soft Shelled.	\$28.00
Johnston Prolific	A large broad nut which also contains broad kernels. Matures early March. Suits coastal regions. Pollinators : Brandes Jordan Soft Shell	\$28.00
Mission	A vigorous upright tree that produces a good crop of nuts with hard soft shells. Matures end of march. Kernels are plump and attractive. Pollinators : Californian Papershell & Fritz.	\$28.00
Fritz	A strong tree. Nuts have large plump kernels, light brown in colour. A good flavoured almond. Matures early April. Pollinators : Californian Papershell & Mission Papershell.	\$28.00
Self Pollinating	A self-fertile almond which flowers mid season. Tree is upright growing. Nut is large and a papershell. Pollinates other mid season varieties.	\$28.00
CHESTNUTS		
Morena	A vigorous growing tree, producing heavy crops of almost black coloured nuts. This variety will produce regularly every year. Ripens a few days after Early Brown.	\$38.00
Manjimup Mahogany	Probably the most pleasing to look at, Manjimup mahogany has a dark shiny skin with brown stipes. This variety matures around mid April. The largest known chestnut. Not a heavy cropper.	\$38.00
Neil's Special	A vigorous tree, very similar to Manjimup Mahogany. Nut is free falling, husk is reddish in colour with brown stripes. Matures the same time as Manjimup Mahogany.	\$38.00

Jonathan	A small-medium fruit with red skin on a yellow background. Flesh is sweet with extremely good flavour. Matures early march. Pollinators : Granny Smith and Golden Delicious	\$28.00
Golden Delicious	A prolific bearer of large, golden fruit, with a crisp sweet flesh. A good cooking variety that stores well. Matures mid February. Pollinators : Granny Smith & Red Delicious.	\$28.00
Granny Smith	Bright green in colour with crisp white flesh and medium to large in size. Matures start of April. An excellent cooking apple which keeps very well. Pollinators : Red Delicious, Gala & Red Fuji.	\$28.00
Red Fuji/Naga FU2	A round fruit which is medium to large in size. Skin is red over green-yellow, flesh is white, crisp and sweet. Matures mid April. Pollinators : Gala, Golden Delicious, Red Delicious, Lady Williams and Sundowner. Part self-fertile.	\$28.00
Sundowner	A low chilling variety. Tree is similar to Pink Lady. Red skin with firm sweet flesh with a slightly acidic taste. Stores well. Matures mid May. Pollinators : All other varieties except Anna and Dorset Gold.	\$28.00
Lady Williams	A red apple That matures late, but stores very well. Known to be a heavy cropper. Tree is medium in size. Matures mid June. Pollinators : Red Delicious, Golden Delicious and Granny Smith.	\$28.00

Waltz	Fruiting Apple - Large, sweet flavoured apples which are red over green. Matures late March. Will maintain a columnar shape without pruning. Pollinated by most other apples or crab apples. Good for narrow garden beds.	\$38.00

White Adriatic	Medium to large size fruit, with brown to green coloured skin. Flesh is a red to pink colour. An excellent flavoured variety. Matures mid summer. Good for jam.	\$22.00
Adam	Medium - large size fruit with blue coloured skin. Ripens mid season. A high quality dessert variety.	\$22.00
White Genoa	Large fruit with green to yellow coloured skin. Flesh is pink to amber coloured. Matures February, a good eating variety and also jam making. Sweet tasting.	\$22.00

Early Burlat	An early cherry dark in colour and relatively large. An outstanding early cherry with a good flavour. Has a short stem. Pollinators : Vista, Van, Stella, Bing, Larian and Rainier. Matures late November.	\$28.00
Rons Seedling	A very large, kidney shaped cherry. The skin is mahogany to black with moderate cracking resistance. Matures late November. Pollinators : Burgsdorf and Van.	\$28.00
Van	A large cherry with crisp, sweet, dark red flesh. A good cropper, can over crop at times, has shown rain cracking resistance. Pollinators: Bing, Stella, Rainier, Sunburst and Rons Seedling. Short stem. Matures late December.	\$28.00
Bing	Large fruit with dark red skin and firm flesh, matures end of December-beginning of January. Good storage and shipping qualities. Has an average stem length. Pollinators : Van, Early Burlatt, Larian and Stella.	\$28.00
Stella	Our most popular variety as it is self-fertile. The trees habit is very vigorous with dark red to black fruit. Matures late December to early January. Excellent bearer, also a Universal Pollen Donor.	\$28.00
Sunburst	A very large red cherry with a good flavour, another self-fertile variety, Has a medium stem. Matures late December to early January. Another choice variety for the home gardener.	\$28.00

Smyrna	A very large fruit, shaped like a pear. Skin is yellow in colour when ripe. Tree bears heavily. Matures in April. Excellent for stewing or jelly. Self-fertile.	\$28.00

Plumcott	A medium size fruit, round in shape. Starts of pale yellow then turning red at full maturity. Skin is soft and downy as with apricots. Pollinators : Mariposa plum or Story apricot. Matures late January - early February.	\$28.00

Flordagold	A large firm fruit, 40 - 70 % light red on yellow skin. The flesh is juicy and yellow/amber in colour. Semi-clingstone. A medium-low chill variety, 325 units. Keeps well. Matures late November.	\$28.00
Tropic Snow	A large to medium size fruit. Skin is pale pink on green. White flesh, freestone. A low chill peach, 250 units. Matures late November, early December. Highly resistant to bacterial spot.	\$28.00
